Dearly Beloved in Christ,

Greetings in the precious name of our Lord and saviour Jesus Christ.

After a brief gap, we are resuming the 'Suvishesha Pathrika' again to carry the news, developments and testimonies in the mission fields. I am happy to inform that our

mission activities are well coordinated and our Missionary Achens, Mission Coordinators and Evangelists are discharging their responsibilities faithfully and powerfully. This is giving a momentum in all our evangelistic endeavours.

We, as a team, visited Vidarbha-Gadchiroli and Chandra-pur-Amravati region from June 25-28, 2022. Apart from Mr. V. P. Simon (Diocesan Treasurer), we had representation from Thane Mar Thoma Church and St. Stephens Mar Thoma Church, Marol. Rev. Nitin John Chacko (Diocesan Mission Coordinator) and Rev. Robin Raj (Vicar - St. Stephens Mar Thoma Church, Marol) were also part of the team. It was a rewarding and enriching experience. We could see the spiritual enthusiasm and vigour of our believers in various mission fields. The Missionaries are striving to do their best in reaching out to so many additional villages in and around our mission fields. Rev. Christy V. Varughese and Rev. Jobin John are providing very good leadership in coordinating and extending the mission activities. I thank God for their commitment and hospitality.

We could visit the land at Katli in Gadchiroli. The Diocese has purchased 2.77 acres of land and this land has to be developed at the earliest as the centre of all our mission projects in that region. The Diocese is grateful to Thane Mar Thoma Church and St. Stephens Mar Thoma Church, Marol for sponsoring the chapel and mission house respectively. We need sponsors for building the boys' and girls' hostel in

that campus. A school, clinic and other community related projects can be conceived and developed in that land at a later stage. I hope and pray that this centre will be a beacon of light for the community at large.

We are planning to purchase a house and a property at Khardi for the Missionary Achen of Thane region. Once the Diocesan Assembly approves the decision of the Diocesan Council, we would be able to proceed in that direction.

We organized a family empowering program for our Evangelists and their families at Mar Chrysostom Ashram, Kamshet from 3-5 June, 2022. It was well attended and well organized. I appreciate the efforts of the Missionary Achens and Mission Coordinators in organizing such programs to empower and equip our evangelists, so that they will work and minister more effectively in the fields they are placed in.

I would like to thank all the sponsoring parishes for the contributions to our mission programs. There are also few individuals who are helping us out in our financial needs. We need to bring more volunteers and friends for the 'Friends of Mission' movement so that our mission programs will be a concerted effort by our people.

I hope and pray that this publication will bring in awareness to our people about our mission programs in different places. Please continue to uphold our Missionary Achens, Coordinators and Evangelists who are there in our mission fields and are facing lots of adverse situations. May God Bless You all!

Evangelists' Family Conference: In-person again!

Glad that we are resuming our *Suvishesha Patrika*. This issue is an Evangelists Family Conference special edition. The 9th Evangelists' Family Conference of the Mumbai Diocesan Mission was held at the Mar Chrysostom Ashram, Kamshet from June 3-5, 2022 with prayerful guidance from Rt. Rev. Dr. Euyakim Mar Coorilos Suffragan Metropolitan, Diocesan Bishop and the presence of Rev. Dr. John Joseph, Diocesan Secretary/Missionary.

This annual conference provides evangelists and their families an opportunity to come together to be nourished by a focused study of God's Word and family centric sessions at the Mar Chrysostom Ashram and Mar Thoma Camp Centre, Kamshet, in a setting that's relaxing and surrounded by acres of natural beauty.

While sessions for the adults were conducted in the course of the three days, VBS was simultaneously held for the children of the evangelists. Ensuring every member of the family was catered to.

The theme chosen for this year was देवाचे तेज (God's Radiance) – Hebrews 1:3. The main talks for the couples were led by Mr. Peter Luis (BYM) and the family sessions were coled by the husband-wife duo of Mrs. & Mr. Vijay Bansode. Interactive VBS sessions for the children were led by a team

of young friends from different parishes of our diocese. Children from age 4 to 15 were divided into different groups. 'God's radiance' was chosen as the theme for the VBS too. Messages were conveyed and children engaged through various means including singing, devotions, classes, craft, games and innovative outdoor ac-



tivities. Volunteers shared how much they were touched by the warmth and enthusiasm of the children and by the whole experience.

This year 12 Bible trainees who completed the Evangelist Training Course at the Mar Chrysostom Centre for Mission & Development Studies were commissioned during the Evangelist Family Conference on June 3, 2022 to serve as Evangelists in the Mumbai Diocesan Mission. Rev. Dr. John Joseph, Rev. K. C. Chacko and all the missionary Achens provided leadership to the commissioning service.

From start to end, the conference was a blessing for the 32 Evangelists, their spouses and 34 children and all those who attended it.

Up Close & Personal

Memories and learnings - my first evangelist camp 2022

Over the years, I have been to many conferences, camps and retreats, however, the evangelist camp was different and the most enriching experience till date.

It was two and a half days of power packed non-stop activities starting at 7 am and ending late at night with energy levels intact. I felt young again. I caught a glimpse of the conviction of the evangelists and their faith in Jesus Christ. Their mission and vision to win souls for the Lord amazed me. Though not born into the same faith community, they were clear about whom they now served. It was in complete sync with the theme for the study of the senior class – Saul's conversion on the way to Damascus – Acts 9:1-19.

As a first-time teacher at the camp, I would like to share my takeaway, learnings and first-hand experience:

We were three teachers for the Senior class with just four students in the age group of 14-15 years (owing to some last minute drop outs). Though a bit anxious to start with, by God's grace, we were able to make the main theme and study engaging over three days, and connect with them individually.

Activities that were planned really helped them to get involved and served as an ice-breaker and made the sessions more relevant to them.

Common singing sessions were held for all age groups. All who led the singing sessions made it very lively and ensured complete participation not just from all the children, but volunteers and teachers too.

There was clockwork precision and harmony among the teachers in conducting the classes and maintaining discipline throughout these sessions. I experienced fellowship in the true sense.

In our conversations during common sessions and meal times, I was able to understand a bit about their mission fields. My professional challenges seemed nothing compared to what they faced almost every day.

The evangelists and their families came across as very simple people, warm and affectionate, ready to learn more; interacting with enthusiasm. Their company touched me a lot.

The Talent Night on the 4th of June was one of the camp's highlights. I experienced for the first time a Qa-

wwali being sung in worship of the Lord.

The preparation, and attire chosen for each act of the talent night was done with great sincerity. I could clearly see how they used their abilities for glorifying their Lord Almighty.

One of the skits that really touched me during the talent night was a real-life story of a petty thief whose life transformed after hearing the Gospel from our evangelists.

I always shy away from dancing, but I could not hold back at the end of our session on the last day. I jumped into the ring and, shedding all my inhibitions, danced joyfully.

I carried back home three observations from the camp: everyone was treated equal with no hierarchies; energy levels and enthusiasm were different from what was seen in other camps; and a deep sense of God's presence and guidance and the Master's leading was felt each day of the camp.

God willing, I would love to be a part of the next Evangelist Family camp in 2023.
